- The Board of Trustees meets twice a year in June and December, to review applications and award grants.

- After receipt of your application, it will be reviewed by the Board of Trustees at their next meeting. They determine the amounts and recipients of the funds.
- Applicants may be personally contacted by a representative of the Trust for verification and additional information before the review. Therefore, you do not need to be present at the review meeting.
- Grants are limited to not more than \$1,000 annually for an individual and \$5,000 annually for an organization. Please give very specific details on items and amounts in which you are applying for.
- No individual, family unit, group, organization, or charity can receive funds from the trust more often than every eighteen months (adopted by the Darke Rural Electric Cooperative Board of Trustees beginning January 1, 2008).
